Red and Yellow Marble Salad

1/4 pound baby red potatoes

1/4 pound Yukon Gold potatoes

1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil

1 pint red cherry tomatoes, halved

1 pint yellow cherry tomatoes, halved 1 green chili, diced (such as serrano or jalapeno)

1/8 cup champagne vinegar or white wine vinegar

1 lime zested and juiced

1 cup tightly packed arugula leaves, chopped Salt and pepper to taste

Preheat the oven to 375°. Toss the potatoes with the oil and place on a baking tray. Cook the potatoes in the oven for 20-25 minutes until tender. With the potatoes still warm, gently toss together with all the remaining ingredients in a bowl. Refrigerate 2 hours before serving.
